Tournament Rules:

1. Players will start with 25,000 in tournament chips.
2. Levels will last 30 minutes each. This is a one-day tournament.
3. On-site registration and unlimited re-entries available until the start of level 9. Players may forfeit their tournament chips at the end of registration to re-enter.
4. Entries purchased prior to the start of the tournament will be considered live and in play. Alternates and entries purchased after the start of the tournament will have no obligation and will not be live until the player has been dealt in. Alternates and late entries may have to wait for a seating assignment. Alternates not sat during the registration period will be entitled to a refund.
5. Management reserves the right to alter, change or cancel this tournament. Management will not be held responsible in the event of typographical errors or misinformation on websites or printed materials and players will have no claim in these matters.
6. Any unauthorized chips introduced into tournament play will be immediately removed upon detection without substitution. Any parties determined to be responsible of the foreign chips will be disqualified with no refund. It is all tournament player's responsibility to bring to management's attention unusual chips, circumstances or irregularities. Tournament Director's decisions are final. Should a patron wish to dispute that decision, they may file a formal dispute with the Seminole Tribal Gaming Commission.
7. Residents of foreign countries without a U.S. tax treaty will be subject to tax withholdings.
8. Tournament entries are non-transferable and non-refundable. Entries won through Poker Room promotions into this tournament are non-transferable and non-refundable.
9. \$330 entry fee will be used to fund the prize pool. \$70 is a registration fee of which \$25 will go towards staffing fee.
10. This tournament will be played 8 handed. 1 in 8 (Approx. 12.5% of the field) will be in the money.
11. Redraw at 9 players or at tournament director's discretion.
12. The starting game to be determined by a random draw at the starting of the tournament and final table (Omaha 8, Stud 8). Games will be rotated every 8 hands. Stud game is played with an individual ante.
